Captain's Corner With Capt Brian (BJ)

It's getting to be that season when you can almost always catch a handful of 'tails. On Wednesday morning the water temperature on the edge of the reef was 76.9 degrees. That's close to an ideal temperature for these fish to feed in.



I've found that the prime temperature zone is from 78 to 82 degrees. If you have water in this range the 'tails will be going nuts!

Some reasons why you may not succeed in fishing for 'tails while they are really biting well: current into the wind, crystal clear water, improper technique, natural predators spooking the fish, or your line is too thick (heavy). The current running up into the wind makes it very difficult to properly present the bait. The clearer the water the more likely the fish are to see your hook and line. You want dirty water so they are feeding more on scent than sight.

Technique wise, you need to present your bait just like a piece of chum or you might as well go to the fish market and buy your fresh catch. Cudas, porpoises, sharks, kingfish, gannet birds, amberjacks and even groupers can easily turn a school of fish off like a light switch. Heavy line has the same effect as clear water. The heavier your line is the easier the fish will see it. Basically, here in the Keys you should NEVER use anything

ier your line is the easier the fish will see it. Basically, here in the Keys you should NEVER use anything heavier than 20 pound test. If the fish you are catching are under 2 pounds you want to use 10 to 12 pound. 2 to 4 pounds I would recommend stepping up to 15 pound test and anything larger requires rope (20 pound).
